Requires consent to be specific, voluntary, and informed.

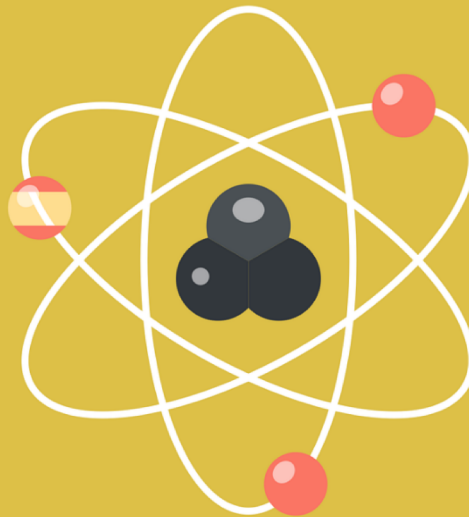


Draft Code of Conduct for Research

Research and development that is collaborative, transparent and reproducible and whose outputs are publicly available.



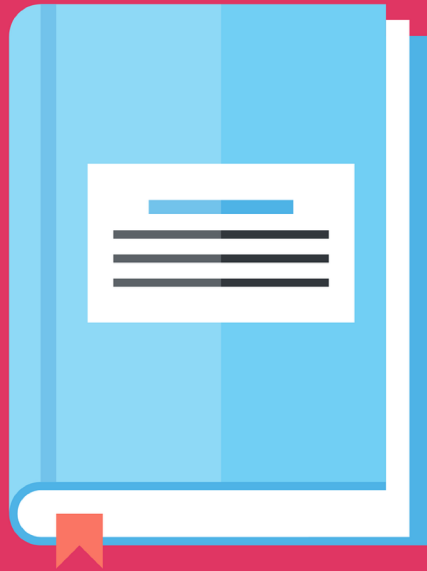
Open consent

Requires participants to take (and pass) an examination.
